# Minutes of the meeting held on 16 May 2023

Present: Cllrs Thane (in the Chair), Paterson, Pengelly, Skinn, Taylor and ward Cllr Corless Also in attendance was the Clerk

# **Public Forum** Seven members of the public were present

Two residents spoke during the public forum to object to the planning application at 1 Temple Close, agenda item 7a (ii). Objections were raised in relation to the height of the fence, which residents considered was out of keeping with the area. Residents stated that the fence obstructed their view of the highway placing pedestrians and other motorists at risk. Residents complained that the application was retrospective and that works had been completed before a formal planning application had been made. The Chair reminded the objectors that this matter rested with the Planning Authority ERC and not the Parish Council. Residents stated that a 1.8 m trellis had previously been in place, with an end panel never installed to maintain a clear view of the highway, and would like to see the final panel in the sequence and adjacent hedging removed. The Chairman reminded those present that the hedge was not part of the planning application.

## 2531 East Riding of Yorkshire Councillor's report

Cllr Corless reported that ward Cllrs were to meet with Wykeland to address unanswered questions from residents, for example the provision of a lorry park at Melton.

Concerns had been received from residents in Brickyard Lane in relation to HGV on street parking; ERC had recently consulted Parish Councils on potential restrictions for HGVs the outcome of which was yet to be advised.

Ferriby residents continued to raise concern regarding noise at night and odor from an unidentified source. Residents had been advised to log incidents on the ERC portal.

The Parish Council recommend that the final panel adjacent to the footpath is removed to address highway safety issues.

## Assessment of Welton Pond

The Clerk advised that until the likely costs of potentially draining and repairing the pond were established, other than contractual payments, expenditure including on larger projects be suspended immediately, for a short period of time, to ensure that the Parish Council had sufficient funds going forward to meet any repair costs.

It was noted that the contract for the Parish Council's mobile phone had expired and a new package had been identified at a monthly cost of £13.00 for which members' approval was sought.

## Melton Underpass CCTV update

The Clerk drew members' attention to further correspondence from ERC, reoffering grant funding towards the installation of CCTV at Melton Underpass.
